From the Bridge - Pete Stevenson

It seems it is still my turn to write this introductory piece to the Pilot. This task would be much easier if we were swamped with boating news and activity but, alas, Covid still lurks and many activities are curtailed.

Nonetheless we do have some plans which will be addressed or explained in other sections of the Pilot. The big one, of course, is the plan to visit Charleston by way of the Cooper River. The plan includes the scenic trip up and down the Cooper, some co operative charting in Charleston and, of course, the City itself. Always a great trip, hope you can make it.

I must tell you about the great boat theft, actually a recovery of property, or the story of two adventurers who rescued a vessel in distress, that took place right here in the Anderson Hartwell area.

Sometime ago I surveyed a big Carver which was very much a rehabilitation project that wound up with new engines, a lot of cosmetic work and more than a years time. One of the last things achieved was reupholstering of all of the exterior seating and cushions. The upholstery repair was excellent. So much so that I secured the name of the expert and took my little runabout to him for some sorely needed upgrades. After four months I got the boat back with a partially completed project. The work that had been done was good and I made a partial payment, but the boat was unfinished. After returning from the Tennessee River cruise last October, I took the boat back to the shop for completion. Six months later there was no word and no boat.

I had had enough, so I planned to recover the vessel. I recruited an accomplice and we went to the shop.

The yard was a mess with at least twenty cars and trucks in various states of disrepair scattered about. But no boat. A loud radio was playing in one of the buildings, and after knocking on doors, tapping on windows, and calling out it seemed quite clear that no one was there. I tried several times to call the upholsterer but no answer. After twenty minutes the boat was found in a lean to behind a building, covered with cardboard and dirt. No new work had been achieved. The vessel was blocked in by a zero turn mower and guarded by a pit bull on a chain. Fortunately, the key was in the mower and it started. We tamed the pit bull, she was young and sweet and underfoot but not aggressive, so we moved the mower out of the way. Then we hooked the boat up to the truck and drove off, greatly relieved that there had been no confrontation. You may be sure that the neighborhood, the clutter in the (junk) yard and the isolation had our nerves a tingle.



Sometime later I did receive a call from the craftsman and I explained to him that I had the boat and that, as he had not accomplished anything since October. I owed him nothing and our relationship was complete. He agreed. End of story.

I expect to have the boat ready for this summer's fun on the water.



Revisiting Fuel Hazards

The recent fuel crisis in the southeast has brought to light some dangerous and deadly situations related to fuel and fueling.



Incident #1: A cruiser with six persons aboard and a jet ski exploded at a fuel dock on lake Lanier resulting in serious burns to a woman and two teens. The fuel dock was also engulfed. The details are unknown, but this incident highlights the caution we must take when fueling our vessels as well as our lawn equipment.

Incident #2: A Pickens County woman wrecked her car containing several five-gallon cans of gas. The car promptly exploded, and she escaped but was seriously burned. I know some of us prefer to use port-

able gas cans to refuel our boats rather than pay high marina fuel prices, but this practice exposes us to more risk of explosion particularly when transporting the fuel.

Let's let these examples of recent events be a "Heads Up" for us to remind us that extra caution is required when handling gasoline.
